

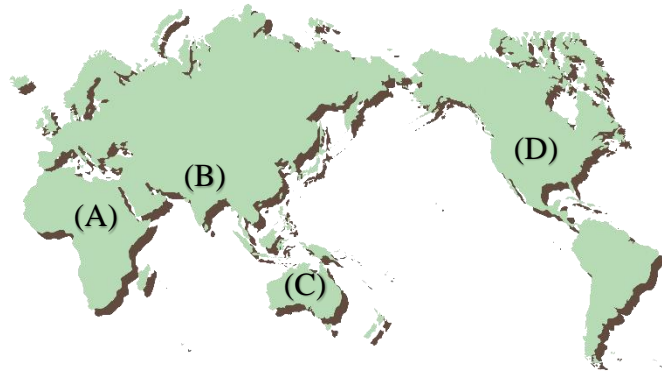

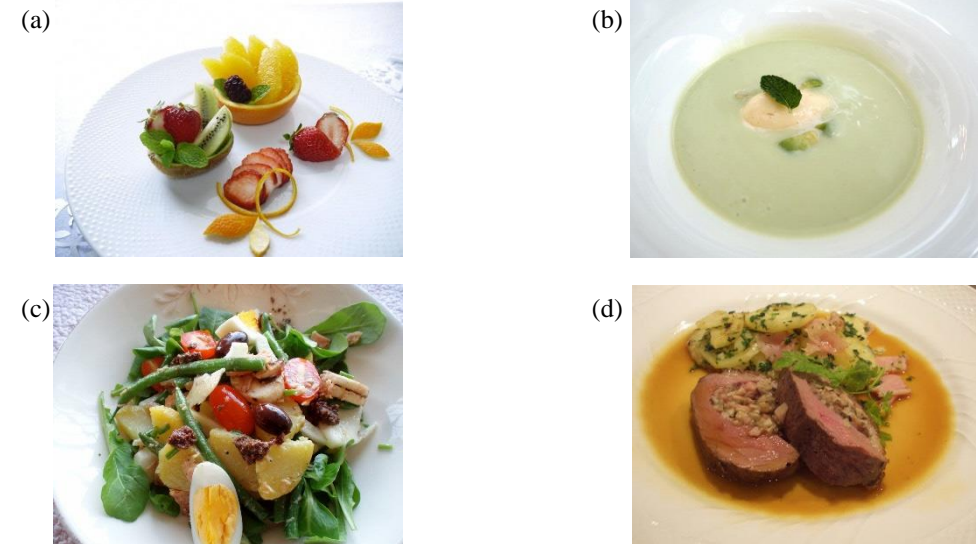

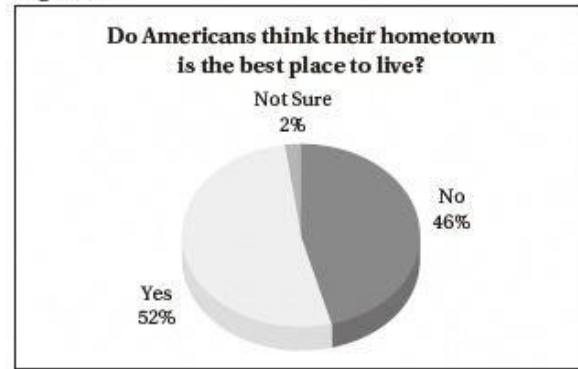
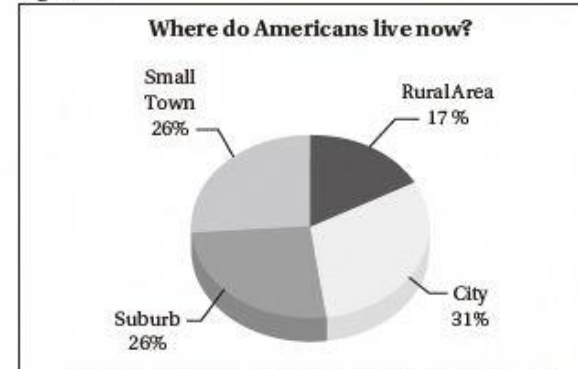
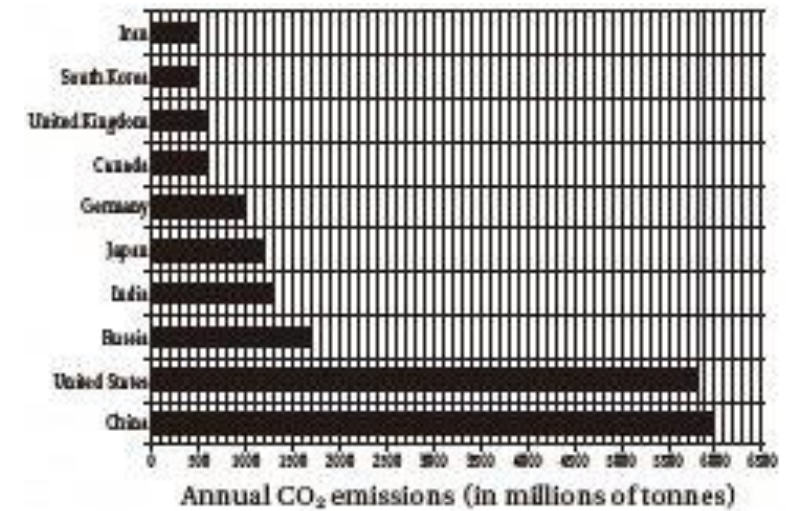

Many countries around the world have been working hard to (1) CO₂ emissions, believed by many scientists to be one of the main causes of global warming. For certain countries which are not (2) industrialized, such as Iran, the level of CO₂ is not a problem. Among the long-time industrialized countries, some have made great progress in reducing their emissions, such as the case of the United Kingdom and Germany. Also, among countries which (3) high growth rates from the 1960s through 1980s, South Korea and Japan have made some progress in reducing emissions, through use of new more efficient technologies such as hybrid cars. A more recent problem is the increasing emissions of economies which are showing rapid growth in the 1990s and 2000s. These include India, Russia and China. (4) currently has the highest amount of CO₂ emissions, and emissions from Russia and India have increased steadily (5) the past ten years. But it is the United States, which is ironically the home to many environmentalists and scientists who work on the problems of global warming, which still seems to do little to reduce its CO₂ levels.
